## A short history of the Women to Women Giving Circle by Myra Gordon

#### **SEEDS ARE PLANTED**

Our Community Foundation has always had a leadership vision of helping develop philanthropy right here at home. The world of philanthropy did not always see the potential giving power of women. Just over a decade ago, the Illinois Prairie Community Foundation began to ask, "How can we change that?"

We started by inviting women attending IPCF's first Philanthropist of the Year luncheon in 2009 to stay after lunch and attend a Women's Philanthropy session to discuss how powerful our giving can be. About 20 women attended and listened to Tracy Gary, a non-profit consultant, ask us for our vision of local women's philanthropy and what it could mean. The answers were inspiring, but also practical.



#### FROM DREAMS TO A REAL RESULT

We wanted to develop a group of women who would

- give grants to local non-profits for the benefit of women and children
- identify important issues affecting local women
- assure that the grant monies were well-spent
- celebrate successes together
- and build among us bonds as philanthropists and friends.

We wanted a structure that would provide funds not only for the current year's grants but also to build a Women to Women Fund Endowment that would provide a forever stream of future funding.

#### **100 FOUNDING MEMBERS**

Pat Grogg and Myra Gordon, then Executive Director of the Community Foundation, got together at a local Thai Restaurant. Myra knew that Giving Circles had worked successfully within Community Foundations. "What would it take to have a successful Giving Circle?" Pat asked. "What if we could recruit 100 women to each contribute \$3,000 over three years as Founding Members?" Pat, who had had many successful careers, knew how to build an organization, and having Pat lead the effort was crucial to its success.

We drew up lists of women we knew who cared deeply about local women and children. We created a plan to not just ask for money, but to have programs each year to educate ourselves about issues affecting local women and children. Women were asked to become Founding Members and to tell their friends.

And they did! It didn't happen overnight, but our Women to Women Giving Circle began with 103 Founding Members and has gone on to involve more than 300 women.

All gifts to the Giving Circle incur a 10% administrative fee, are then split with half going to the current year's grants, and the other half going to the endowment. Membership in the Circle is extended to any donor who gives \$100 or more.
