



2024 SHULMAN JEWISH EDUCATION & LIFE GRANTS INFORMATION

DESCRIPTION

Shulman Grants are made possible by an estate gift from Dr. Sol Shulman, professor of chemistry at Illinois State University for 23 years, who passed away in December 2010. Shulman Grants focus on Jewish educational programs and materials, Jewish-themed arts, music, and theater programs, and Jewish cultural enrichment programs in DeWitt, McLean, Livingston and Logan counties that are open to all. Examples of educational programs include books for libraries, lectures, school curriculum and the like. Programs and projects that benefit larger rather than smaller numbers of people are preferred.

Applications may be submitted from February 1 – February 29, 2024

Applications must be submitted via the online grant portal; no paper applications accepted

If you apply for a Shulman Grant, you may not apply for the identical program to the IPCF General and IPCF/Mirza Arts & Culture Grants, which run concurrently with Shulman Grants. You may, however, apply under multiple grant categories if the applications are for distinctly different programs and fit the criteria listed for the particular grant category.

- ~\$33,000 is available to award through multiple grants

- Applicants are required to use a budget document developed by the IPCF Grants Committees; form can be downloaded through the online grant application; Word and Excel files are available
- **Submission deadline is February 29, 2024 at 5:00 p.m. (Central Time)**; the online grant application system automatically closes all applications at the 5 p.m. deadline
- Grant applicants will be notified of the outcome of their grant request by end of April 2024
- Grant funding is for the period of **June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025**
- Those organizations awarded grants will be sent a link to a Grant Agreement on the grant portal; the Executive Director, CEO, or President of the Board must approve the document which outlines conditions and requirements for accepting the grant award

Grant awards will be distributed beginning in May 2024.

We regret that not all projects can be funded. A denial should not be viewed as a negative reflection on an organization or program, but rather a result of the number of applications received and the amount of funding available

REQUIREMENTS

Grant Eligibility

- Program must deal specifically with the grant focus listed above; funding may support a new or existing program
- Applicants must have tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code, operate under a fiscal sponsor that is a 501(c)3 organization, be a local unit of local, county, state or federal government or be a tax-exempt religious organization as recognized by the IRS
- Program must be available to residents of McLean, DeWitt, Livingston or Logan counties; however, programs do not have to serve all four counties
- Program must be operated and organized in such a manner that no applicable anti-discrimination laws are violated
- Organizations that have received past grants from Illinois Prairie Community Foundation must be current on all grant Final Reports
- Executive Director, CEO or President of the Board of an organization applying must approve the application

What Is Not Funded

- Non program-related expenses
- Endowment campaigns
- Annual fundraising events and expenses
- Capital improvements or expenditures
- Conference or continuing education expenses
- Scholarships

IMPORTANT DATES

February 29, 2024 – Applications due by 5:00 p.m. (Central Time); no applications will be accepted after that time.

End of April 2024 – Applicants notified of the Grants Committee's and IPCF Board of Directors' decisions

To begin the online grant application, go to

After creating a new account or logging in, you will be directed to an Apply page showing all open grant applications for the spring grant cycle. Click on the Shulman Jewish Education & Life Grant application to begin. Logging in to the online grant portal allows you to start an application, finish a previously started and saved application, check the status of a previous application or complete follow-up reports assigned for successful grantees.
